Minutes from April 25th, 2023 reviewed; motion made and seconded; minutes approved

Continued Discussion on Regional Workforce Development efforts

- Bylaws have been approved by both City Councils
- Goal is to have EDCs and Chambers serve as the voice of the community to advise what is being seen in the workforce
- This idea will be considered moving forward as we finalize our structure and goals
- The name of the board would need to be approved by the cities; we could present a recommendation for consideration

- We will remain the CTTC Advisory Board for this year (in name) as we move forward with new scope and structure
- Naming of building will stay the same for now due to signage needing to be completed

Meeting schedules

- Desire for more organizational structure and clearer communication; Chair, Secretary and city representatives will meet to review meeting representatives to ensure all parties get invitation
- Consideration of second Tuesday of each month (must meet at least every other month)
 - Motion made and seconded
 - Next meeting will be September 12 and will continue each second Tuesday after that for the appointed Board representatives
 - We will schedule partner updates with requests for what we want to hear as needed
- Method of communication to share what we want on the agendas needs to be refined:
 - Secretary will work with Shannon at City of NB to get calendar and will email group for requests on agenda input one week ahead of agenda being posted
 - Email or call the chair for items you'd like to see on Agenda
- Secretary will send draft meeting minutes to Shannon at the City of NB and she will send them out by the end of the week for review; updates will be done at the next meeting

Reports/Updates

- ISD Partners: Comal ISD, New Braunfels ISD, Seguin ISD, Navarro ISD
 - Enrollment numbers, biggest programs, industry certifications offered, current initiatives and looking ahead
 - Request to see list of IBCs offered and how that connects to industry
 - Feel free to send Advisory
- Northeast Lakeview
 - Just posted CTTC Director position
 - o Police Officer is retiring and a new one is starting 8-5 and another evening
 - Repainted, added accent walls to give a more college feel
 - Will take pictures of students here and start hanging them
 - Enrollment Express
 - 14 students attended and 14 enrolled
 - 14 sections being offered; will have low enrollment but needing to get started
 - Semester starts August 28
 - Replaced wiring, computers, projectors
 - There will be an IT tech rotating here for assistance
 - Boosting wi-fi
 - Marketing
 - Banners in cities, radio ads, Spotify, etc.
 - Building signage will be up August 31

- Will bring a breakdown of investment they have put in
- Advocacy center will be bringing grab-and-go food, looking to add vending machines, including healthy food choices
- Chemistry lab still needs gas
- Will be absorbing all costs for books for ECHS
- Will be bringing Cybersecurity program here once computers are up to par
- Engineering program 100 seats; when they finish, they are accepted to any Texas A&M

- TSTC/TxFAME

- Filled 4 positions
 - VP, Admin, Success Coach and Recruiter
- Signage and remodeling done, working with Fire Marshal to finalize a few things
- Equipment is installed
- Will start the year with 15-16 participants
- o Orientation begins August 21, school starts on August 28
- Legislative, EDCs
 - Josh shared that the 2 bills that were passed, including HB 4997 for open enrollment in Guadalupe and Comal counties, which opens opportunity for enrollment outside of TxFAME
 - Looking how to move forward with next steps, will be picking up steam and moving forward; there will be more to come
 - Michele shared that Mike with NB has been doing local visits with companies:
 - Detex started a soldering program with TSTC
 - Seeing a need for welding, lack of training for that
 - As companies increase productivity, looking more and more towards robotics – how to operate and work on them
 - Working with UTSA on an EDA grant for a Tech Hub with partners
 - Working with Workforce Solutions Alamo to launch Power of Partnerships
 - Looking at wraparound services, skills gap and other issues such as transportation and childcare (looking at "Early Matters SA" concept)
