A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEW BRAUNFELS, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AN ADVANCE FUNDING AGREEMENT WITH THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR THE DRY COMAL CREEK HIKE AND BIKE TRAIL PROJECT FUNDED THROUGH THE ALAMO AREA METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES PROGRAM.

**WHEREAS**, the Alamo Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (AAMPO) issued a call for Transportation Alternatives (TA) Program projects for the FY 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); and

**WHEREAS**, the City of New Braunfels submitted the Dry Comal Creek Hike and Bike Trail Project (Dry Comal Trail), including an ADA compliant 10' wide concrete trail for .85 miles along the Dry Comal Creek from the Walnut Ave bridge to the Landa Street bridge, for consideration in the program; and

**WHEREAS**, the Dry Comal Trail Project was selected for funding through the AAMPO funding program to improve pedestrian mobility in New Braunfels; and

**WHEREAS,** as a requirement of the TIP, the City of New Braunfels is responsible for 20% of the construction cost, \$473,200, with the remaining 80% being provided federally through the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT); and

**WHEREAS**, the City of New Braunfels is also responsible for TxDOT's direct costs, \$45,452 associated with project review, inspection, administration, and oversight due 30 days from execution of the AFA; and

WHEREAS, the City of New Braunfels is authorized to enter into an agreement with TxDOT and confirms the financial commitment including payment of overruns through the City of New Braunfels' capital project funding programs; and

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEW BRAUNFELS, TEXAS:

**THAT**, the City Manager is authorized to enter into an Advance Funding Agreement between the City of New Braunfels and Texas Department of Transportation, further authorized to execute all necessary documents, and accept funding associated with the Dry Comal Creek Hike and Bike Project.
