2. Roll call; Quorum established
3. No Citizen’s Communications presented
4. Introductions and Welcome
  - Introduction of all members, welcome to the newly appointed representatives. Briefing on purpose of committee and review of By-Laws, including attendance requirements. Overview of where to locate By-Laws online, will be shared via email as well.
5. Minutes from June 10 2025 regular meeting were reviewed and approved
6. Reports
  - ISDs
    - Comal ISD – added 25 industry certificates once students turned 18; still need an Engineering teacher at SVHS; new IBC list will allow us to review offerings; will be posting for a part-time electrician and plumber at all 5 high schools

- NBISD – opening Long Creek CTE facilities, will look forward to industry input on IBCs, up to 54 teachers in CTE department
- Seguin – open Ag, AAVTC, Comp Sci at computer science at middle school, fully staffed at high school; doubled their industry certifications; looking to focus on manufacturing
- Navarro – added a few new teachers; took business to 8<sup>th</sup> grade, added NLC as a PTECH partner and dual credit partner; new Ag teacher is adjunct; November will move items into new school
- TSTC
  - welding program is robust and full, Kim was promoted – a new hire, Robin, will be at the front desk starting soon
- FAME Lone Star Chapter
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> cohort starts soon, 13 spots are filled, 8/26 from 5-7pm is signing day
- NLC at New Braunfels
  - classes start 8/25 – there is a 25% increase in enrollment from Spring 25 to Fall 25, two new science FT staff, IT Lab is up and active, Specialist coming soon, new admin starting soon, Bio/A&P models have been purchased, Evening CNA & Med Tech programs starting soon **\*attachment\***, NLC move/expansion
- Chamber of Commerce
  - No report at this time
- Industries
  - Overall Needs are soft skills and critical thinking skills for new hires, industrial/facilities maintenance, tuition reimbursement opportunities & problem solving, carpentry intro level skill needed, CNAs and RNs in need at GRMC, HS Internship opportunities and creative strategies, operator-focused skills and training
- City of Seguin
  - Real estate closing soon on 133 acres off 46 and Cordova for the TSTC Campus, TX Proposition 1 will be addressed by the Legislature this Fall regarding endowment funds to TSTC for projects, career exploration flyer **\*attachment\***
- City of New Braunfels
- Council approved additional funding from the NBEDC to NLC at New Braunfels to help fund their expansion to a new campus location off Sundance & Old FM 306
- 7. Committee Updates
  - A) Facility Naming & Signage Committee: no update at this time
  - B) Workforce and ISDs Committee: presented document looking at the current landscape of programs offered in secondary schools; what programs each district offers so that we can determine which industries to narrow in on – we know Manufacturing, IT, Health Science and Construction are high demand. Request from industries – what are you looking for? If you are hiring out of high school, what do you want students to know and have – what are realistic expectations?
- 8. Presentation and Discussion
  - A) Josh presented on a study Pflugerville recently completed to address workforce needs in their community, this could be a potential partnership between Seguin and New Braunfels, there is grant funding available through Texas Workforce, cost estimate is around \$150,000, will bring more information forward to the board for potential action/support in the Fall, the study could drive data and decisions for the communities and counties

Many healthcare-related positions require applicants to undergo a criminal background fingerprint test and/or drug screening. A criminal history may prevent licensing, certification or employability. As you are considering a CE program that requires a criminal background/fingerprint test and/or drug screening, are responsible for:

- knowing whether if they are eligible for licensure or certification before committing to a CE program,
- contacting the respective certification agency to find out if a conviction will prohibit them from being certified and able to work in the industry.
- contacting legal counsel to discuss an existing criminal background prior to applying to Alamo Colleges District Continuing Education for guidance.
