## Sec. 6-110. Disposition of domestic animals exposed to rabies.

- (a) Unvaccinated animals which have been bitten or directly exposed by physical contact with a rabid animal or its fresh tissues shall be humanely killed or, if sufficient justification for preserving the animal exists, the exposed animal shall be immediately vaccinated against rabies, placed in strict isolation for 90 days six months, and given a booster vaccination one month prior to release from isolation.
- (b) Vaccinated animals which have been bitten or otherwise significantly exposed to a rabid animal shall be humanely killed or, if sufficient justification for preserving the animal exists, the exposed vaccinated animal shall be given a booster rabies vaccination and placed in strict isolation for 45 days three months.
- (c) The provisions of this section apply only to domestic animals for which an approved rabies vaccine is available.
- (d) The provisions of this section will be in accordance with current state law.
