Dear Mr. Looney:

According to Chapter 395 of the State Government Code, a report should be filed semiannually with the New Braunfels Impact Fee Advisory Committee ("Advisory Committee") that was established to advise the New Braunfels City Council on the Impact Fee program. Pursuant to this report filing requirement, New Braunfels Utilities submits this report to the Advisory Committee for the City of New Braunfels.

Impact Fee balances and activity for the six months ended December 31, 2020 are shown on the following page.

Costs for line extensions in the system are expected to be paid directly by the developments requiring the extensions. The infrastructure improvements included in the CIP were limited to sewer trunk mains greater than 12 inches in diameter, centralized facilities such as expansion to water and wastewater treatment plants, elevated storage tanks, ground storage tanks, booster stations, and lift stations.
