

New Braunfels Public Library Advisory Board Regular Meeting Minutes

New Braunfels Public Library – In-Person Monday, Dec. 13, 2021

1. Call to Order

Library Advisory Board President Connie Born called the meeting to order at 5:36 p.m. on Monday, Dec. 13, 2021.

3. Presentations

a. Westside Library Branch Update

Slab should be poured by the end of December. Most recent timeline involves an August turnover date with an opening of Fall 2022. Once the slab is poured, the walls should go up quickly with a hope of making up some lost time. Parking continues to be a challenge, which impacts programming.

6. Reports

a. Friends of the Library

President Bill Morgan reports the Friends of Library are back from covid. They've had two in-person meetings, the annual book sale brought in \$35,000, and membership is back up to about 235. Donations also continue to pour in.



b. New Braunfels Public Library Foundation

President Andrea Harlan reports the spelling bee on Dec. 6 was a really fun event that they'll hopefully be able to do again next year. The Foundation made about \$6,000. Book Ball invitations will be going out this week. Jean Becker will be speaking at this year's Book & Author Luncheon rather than a standalone event. A team is working on Westside room and shelf range sponsorships.

c. Library Director

Gretchen Pruett reports that "post"-covid, we're at about two-thirds of where we were in terms of circulation pre-covid and at about one-third of where we were in terms of visits. People are still using the library, but with curbside, home delivery, and eResources, patrons don't necessarily have to come into the building. We're in the final stages of the Adult Services Librarian hiring process with second interviews this week and a hope of having the person start in January.
